

BIBLICAL AND THEOLOGICAL STUDIES REQUIREMENTS

Thirty credits of biblical and theological studies are included in the program of each traditional undergraduate student. Transfer students with 45 or more transferable credits at admission that have been completed since high school graduation and students in select high-credit majors are eligible for a reduced requirement. It is recommended that each student take at least one course each semester until the requirement has been fulfilled.

- BBST 4658 Integration Seminar: Redeeming Culture Through Music

1. To be eligible for the reduced Bible requirements, transfer students should submit all official transcripts (high school and college) for evaluation before Biola's first day of classes. Eligibility for this requirement reduction is determined at the time of enrollment (end of the second week of the first semester enrolled) and cannot be updated should more credits be transferred after matriculation.
2. Transfer students with 45 or more transferable credits completed after high school graduation and students in eligible majors will automatically be assigned the requirement reduction but can pursue the Biblical and Theological Studies Minor by taking additional courses as listed in the minor above. Students must file a minor declaration with the Office of the Registrar to have the minor appear on their record and degree audit.

¹ A second BBST 465 course, taken with different content, can serve as a BBST elective.
