## Mission

The mission of the Bachelor of Arts in Sociology (<https://www.biola.edu/degrees/u/sociology-ba/>) is to develop Christian scholars who can critically analyze the effects of social structures on human life and who can apply this knowledge to work toward a world that embodies God's justice and shalom.

## Degree Program

A Bachelor of Arts degree in Sociology is offered upon completion of the University baccalaureate and major requirements. The sociology major requires the completion of 33 credits, 24 of which must be upper-division.
